



CLEP Exams Eligible for Boyce College Transfer Credit

A student who wishes to earn credit for some courses may take the appropriate College Level Examination Program (CLEP) test. If the student achieves the minimum score or higher on a test, that student will receive credit for the course requirement that parallels that test. Credit for CLEP tests counts toward the limit of transfer credit hours, which is 42 for the associate degree and 84 for the bachelor degree (The total allowed transfer credit includes courses from accredited schools as well as credit from CLEP tests). The College Board ID number for Boyce College is **1724**.
